

Eva's Youth Succeeding in Employment Program (YSEP) for young people 15-30 years
Youth who are interested in graphic design whether knowledgeable or not, have the opportunity to do placement at Eva's Print Shop (if accepted)

VIRTUAL TRAINING ONLY

This is a **17-week paid pre-employment** program designed to help young people experiencing barriers to employment find meaningful full-time work. The program consists of the following two elements:

1. **5-week full-time work readiness training** including industry-recognized certification trainings such as Smart Serve, Food Handlers, WHMIS, Health & Safety.
2. **12-week full-time paid placement** with an employer from a variety of sectors including retail, food & beverage, customer service, community work, manufacturing,

Benefits for participants:

- Getting paid (\$14.25 /hr, 35hrs/week) full time/part time placements
- Being equipped with skills and knowledge through industry-recognized certification training
- Enhancing employability by developing core soft skills (e.g. teamwork, conflict resolution, communication, interviewing/networking)
- Securing a bonus of \$200 upon completion of 5-week work readiness training to cover work related expenses (e.g. interview clothes)
- 12-week full-time paid placement through industry-specific job development support
- Eligible participants may have support with Wi-Fi

Eligibility Requirements:

- 15-30 years old
- Has a valid SIN number prior to applying
- Legally entitled to work in Canada (e.g. refugee papers, work permit, etc.)
- Not currently employed or in school full time
- Not currently receiving Employment Insurance
- Available to attend 4-week full-time training (M-F, 9:30am-4:00pm) and able to complete a 12-week placement

Our next cohort begins on May 31st. We will be accepting application until Friday May 14th Any applications received after this date may be wait-listed for the next cohort in July
